(6) The term of this credit union's existence shall be perpetual; *Provided, however,* That upon the finding that this credit union is bankrupt or insolvent or has violated any provision of this organization certificate, of the bylaws, of the Federal Credit Union Act including any amendments thereto or thereof, or of any regulations issued thereunder, this organization certificate may be suspended or revoked under the provisions of Section 16(b) of the Federal Credit Union Act.

(7) This certificate is made to enable the undersigned to avail themselves of the advantages of said Act.

(8) The management of this credit union, the conduct of its affairs, and the powers, duties, and privileges of its directors, officers, committees and membership shall be set forth in the approved bylaws and any approved amendments thereto or thereof.


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7. Not to issue or have outstanding any account or security the form of which, by regulation or in special cases, has not been approved by the Administrator,

1. To pay the reasonable cost of such examinations as the Administrator may deem necessary in connection with determining the eligibility of the applicant for insurance.
2. To permit and pay the reasonable cost of such examinations as in the judgment of the Administrator may from time to time be necessary for the protection of the fund and of other insured credit unions.
3. To permit the Administrator to have access to any information or report with respect to any examination made by or for any public regulatory authority and furnish such additional information with respect thereto as the Administrator may require.
4. To provide protection and indemnity against burglary, defalcation, and other similar insurable losses, of the type, in the form, and in an amount at least equal to that required by the laws under which the credit union is organized and operates.
5. To maintain such regular reserves as may be required by section 116 of this Act.
6. To maintain such special reserves as the Administrator, by regulation or in special cases, may require for protecting the interest of members.

WHEREAS, formal request has been submitted, in accordance with Article XX of the bylaws of this Federal credit union, that the following amendment of its charter ~~and bylaws~~ be approved:

Section 2 shall be amended to read as follows:

"This credit union will maintain its office at Carlsbad, New Mexico, and will operate in the territory described in the field of membership."


Section 5 shall be amended to read as follows:

"The field of membership shall be limited to those having the following common bond: Employees of the International Minerals and Chemical Corporation (Carlsbad Potash Division) who work in or are paid from Carlsbad, New Mexico, or who work in Midland, Texas; employees of this credit union; members of their immediate families; and organizations of such persons."

AND WHEREAS, it appears that the requirements of Article XX ~~and all other~~ requirements of ~~said~~ bylaws pertaining to amendments have been fulfilled, and that the amendment is in the best interest of the members and is not inconsistent with Law,

NOW, THEREFORE, pursuant to the provisions of ~~sections 4, 8, and 20(b)~~ and/or ~~section 10(c)~~ of the Federal Credit Union Act, as amended, and ~~Public Law 915, 80th Congress, 2nd Session~~, the foregoing amendment of the charter ~~and bylaws~~ of the above Federal credit union is hereby approved this 18th day of December, 1954.
